Linda: The \$2200 that went to Region, when was that collected?

Nikki: That was from a literature donation in March.

Kelly: Do we have something kept back for when times are rough?

Nikki: Yes, there is \$6000 in the bank from reserves for our prudent reserves and insurance reserves.

Lynda: So I put in an order for H&I for the next two month, am I going to be able to get that today?

Nikki: Yes

Will: I'm confused about why we're \$1400 in the hole.

Nikki: I've already planned for July. The \$1200 in there is for July but also \$2400 line item for our prudent reserve. July's expenses are reserved for, but July's donations aren't know yet, so hopefully next month's donations will cover our expenses.

Maggie: It says we have a certain amount in the bank, at the bottom is says what that entails, our By-Laws require us to keep 2 months average expenses, so that's where \$2400 is accounted for. We know certain expenses are coming up so that's another \$1200, our By-Laws also say we have to put back \$20 a month for the CAR. Our insurance also \$3000 a year which is going to come up in December so we save enough each month for that. If we have something left over we send it to Region, but if we don't have it then we don't set aside anything. We had it in our By-Laws that we send at least \$75/quarter to Region no matter what because we are the biggest area in the region.

Tana: So last year the donations for June were way more than they are this year. Do we just automatically use the prudent reserve when it's needed and it's rebuilt or is it something the groups vote on.

Maggie: What's the alternative? Not paying the rent?

Tana: I understand we have to use it, I'm just asking if there's a guideline that says if we're not getting enough donations, we're going to use up the prudent reserve pretty quickly?

Bryan: I'll find out and get back to you next month.

Nikki: In my opinion we have to tap into it if we don't have the money but we want to be frugal with our money when we're below.

Hello everyone,

I have a short report this month. I have been working with the H&I chair on some new facilities, and potential new facilities. For two months I have attended H&I business meetings to discuss how we can work together better and continue to keep the lines of communication open. I feel that PR & H&I have a solid connection now, and are working well together.

Maggi attended region this month and I will report what happened there next month.

Phoneline shifts are all filled! Phoneline shift workers are also filling out the phoneline logs. We have nothing to report at this time on the logs.

We are all ready for Unity in the Streets and we have a training set up for August 15th at 1pm at the URS Club. I have worked on getting extra people involved with this to help people in our fellowship learn about PR and what we do.

We have been talking about moving our website to the region's Blue Host account and we basically have decided to do so. The financial impact will be just renewing our domain name yearly and we will have to rent month to month for awhile during the transition after our contract is up in September. I do not have the information about how much it will cost to rent month to month but I can add that to my report later or let everyone know next month. I also don't know how long we will need to rent month to month, But our hope is that it will only be for a few months. We have some things to iron out on our end with the transfer. As I have mentioned in previous reports our site is kind of a mess, basically how it was created. It's old and cumbersome and there is a lot of work to do on our site to make it easier for our Area's webhosts to manage. We have a great deal of support from other web hosts in our region and feel confident that we can iron out all the details - it's just going to take some time. We are going to form a team of people to work on the transfer project.

The PR committee has also voted and is recommending that we only have 3 email boxes listed on our site. This will also not affect anyone. Everyone will still get their mail, it just won't be automatically forwarded through Blue host like it is now. We will be working on getting that set into place and will be working with the administrative body and subcommittees to work out the details of an internal email system.

I continue to work with Outreach, H&I and Phoneline to promote unity and to keep the lines of communication clear with all three committees. We are continuing to work on our guidelines and have another meeting set up for August 4th at 5pm at an unknown location.

Tana: I'm not trying to beat a dead horse, I'm just trying to understand. If I post a meeting or a flyer on Facebook, I'm breaking all of my friends anonymity even if they don't care?

Maggie: I'm on Facebook and I know I can follow threads from friend to a friend and I didn't know if I wanted to be in NA I might not. Everything we put out there reflects on NA.

Teresa: What is the cost for our new website going to come from if our donations are down.

Vera: We already have the money from Area, I'm pretty sure it will be \$10 a month.

Kelly: If I choose to break my own anonymity that's my choice. If we can have things on the internet about NA then what's the difference?

**Outreach: Jason S.**

Outreach met today at 11:30. There were 7 of us which means that there is plenty of room for you to be of service with us. We started the day by reading from our handbook the Outreach Resource Guide. We read and discussed What Does Outreach Do? Some of our members wanted to know what practical service does Outreach provide? We listed the following things that we can or are currently doing to promote unity through group participation in the service structure. We do that by visiting the group and informing them that we can be better together than we can be alone. We can provide workshops or learning days on a variety of group related subjects such as How To Conduct an Effective Business Meeting. We can facilitate Group Inventories. A group inventory is similar to our 4<sup>th</sup> step inventory in that it can clear up some of the confusion & contradiction within our group. They are usually helped along by us asking you come questions from our Traditions that will lead your group to its own conscience. We can start a step writing or support services targeting mail to incarcerated addicts. We can develop & maintain a map of our Area's geographical service area. Lastly we talked about simply loading up a car and going to a meeting. Good old fashioned 12<sup>th</sup> step work which is what Outreach was born from. So all that being said we are willing to serve if asked. We also perform monthly GSR Orientations which connects our groups to the service structure through back and forth communication. Speaking of which, Brian & Robin conducted an orientation today for two new PASC GSRs. If you have a new Alternate or GSR we conduct the orientations every last Saturday before Area at 1pm. Other business we are going to the Dalles, Mens VOA, and Womens VOA to do some Outreach work. The women's VOA is making announcements in NA meetings regarding and NA meeting, so we want to go and let them know we exist to help and make contact. We talked with Vera from PR and possibly after our initial contact PR can make a presentation to VOA about what NA and what type of cooperation we are willing to give to them. Lastly we talked about the upcoming vacancies at Outreach. The positions of Chair & Secretary will be open after next month's PASC. We had an open dialogue about making a decision based on faith not fear, the 4<sup>th</sup> concept, and some honest talk of limitations and assets that all potential trusted servants have. More will be revealed next month. We hope to hear from The Nooner regarding a group inventory. Hopefully we can do that for them in August. We spent \$15 on GSR Orientation booklets this month. It was a great subcommittee meeting and I feel blessed to have the opportunity to serve with those at our meeting and here today. We meet at 11:30 and would love to have you come check us out.
