Discussion:

We also discussed with activities the possibility of having books available to new comers at NA functions. Finally we are exploring contacting treatment centers that are not on the H&I list to see about selling the books to them at a discount. We will provide more information about this next month.

VI. Public Relations: Vera K

Public Relations met in our new location at the URS club this month with 3 new members. I was elected the new chair of PR. Public Relation is in transition right now and my goal is to create a strong committee with people who are interested in doing this type of service. My focus is to move away from the “Warm Body Syndrome” and have people who are willing to give a positive and strong message of what N.A. is and why PR is so vital to our community. We need the help of the whole fellowship to make that happen. I have created a flyer in hopes that the GSR’s can please take them to their meetings and make an announcement about participation with Public Relations in a positive way. There are many service positions on this committee and I strongly encourage people to join and learn more about N.A.

The main thing PR has been working on is the schedule. When I got clean in this town there were seven meetings a day that has since tripled. We are now at a crossroads with our schedule and we have to make some changes. At the PR subcommittee last weekend we decided that we need to go to two pages. We will be adding some information to take up some space on the schedule for instance we will be adding the sub-committee meetings times and locations, also the other local hotline numbers, and some lines for people to write down phone numbers etc... Being a member of this fellowship for a number of years this is so exciting that we are growing. We are in a growing spurt right now and along with that can come some growing pains. The schedule is a vital resource for our community and we have been working on this diligently for years. The time has come to make some necessary changes. We have researched many options and as a temporary solution we decided collectively that a second page is the best option at this time to help make room for all the new meetings. We are faced with two financial decisions. We now pay .07 cents a copy for 1500 schedules that is \$105.00. So for two pages it comes to .14 cents just for the copies for 1500 of the schedules and that would cost \$210.00. However, to collate and staple the two pages it would be an extra .11 cents which would make the schedules.25 cents a schedule and then the cost would be \$375.00 to have Kinko’s staple and collate. If we staple them ourselves it would just cost .14 cents per schedule but someone would have to collate and staple them.

This record has not yet been amended or accepted by a vote of the PASC fellowship

This is part of the growing pains we just have to accept that we have outgrown our current schedule and we have to come up with options that best fit our Area. We have exhausted every avenue and cut so many corners it's just time for us to change. We are asking this body to make the decision. What we are asking for is: Do we pay .14 cents and find someone to staple and collate? Or do we spend .25 cents and just be done with it? We will submit a motion at the June PASC for a vote. Please bring this to your groups and make a decision on our two choices or we will no longer be able to add more meetings to our schedule. Remember this can be a temporary change until we can research another option which will take time and a whole lot more money which is what we have discovered in our preliminary search. - I. **Motion #9-09** Motion submitted by PR seconded Thursday night Freedom Fighters to ratify Vera K as PR subcommittee chair
 - a. Vote:
In favor - 18 Against - 0 Abstentions - 3
 - b. Motion passed**

Open Forum

1. What it is: Why do we restrict meetings to only men or women? Doesn't this go against the 5th tradition?
 - a. Steve: If we follow our traditions strictly no one can be kept out of a meeting.

- b. Maggi: I have been to women's meeting where a man came who needed to be at a meeting. The primary purpose of NA is to carry the message.
 - c. What it is: Can we send information out to groups to clarify that anyone is welcome at any meeting? We could but have to remember that each group is autonomous and no one is the ultimate authority.
 - d. Mic: In 1990's DePaul had men and women's meetings and part of what made that acceptable was that they are an organization and as such can do whatever they want. They still called it an NA meeting. In the history of NA we have women's conventions and a lot of gender specific things that go on, really can't kick anyone out, but things like that do happen. The only sanction would be to report to area and remove the meeting from the schedule.
 - e. Brian (Off the Hook): This men's meeting has asked women to leave and Brian wondered if they were stepping on traditions and if he should bring this up at the business meeting. Feedback: it is up to the group.
 - f. Martin (Early Risers): Had a similar problem with a transgendered person but allowed her to stay. They suggested that she go to women's meeting but allowed her to stay in the meeting since she carries the male role.
 - g. Billey (Determined dames): We need to be sensitive to issues around sexuality and confusion of sexuality. We should keep an open mind and not judge.
 - h. Carol: Just started a women's meeting but always needs to remember our traditions and that we need to carry the message to addict who still suffers.
 - i. Chris: As a member of NA never felt it infringed on his rights to be asked to leave a women's meeting. It doesn't mean that he is not a member. There are also specific meetings for professionals such as doctors and lawyers. These meetings are not in the schedule because if you go to that meeting you will be asked to leave if they are not part of that group.
2. Troy: Feels that we are setting a bad precedent in not giving the groups an opportunity to discuss and vote on major money motions. We also did this with the passing of the bylaws and feels that it is a bad precedent that this wasn't sent back to the groups. No one is being singled out here, but in the bylaws, that were written and passed by this body, it states that anything over \$50 needs to be passed by a 2/3 majority and should be sent back to the groups (**Point of clarification: the bylaws only state the need for a 2/3 majority to pass**).
 - a. Travis: This topic touches upon the question of how can 20 people be the entire contingency of NA in the Portland area. Unfortunately it is since these are the groups who come to area and are the ones who are participating in the area structure. Feels that this has to do with the announcement about the change in the schedule and increase in cost. What was brought today by PR was told to the

GSRs and asked them to take the information back to their groups for discussion. So it is in effect going back to groups.

- b. Vera: not trying to pull the wool out from under everyone. We are in a quandary and need to make a schedule since this is a vital part of the service structure. PR is trying as hard as they can to find the best possible option. The expense will increase and the groups were told about this today so they could take it back to their groups so we can vote on a motion next month.
- c. Linda R: the bylaws actually do not state that major money motions get sent back to the groups, if you read the bylaws it just states that it must be passed by 2/3 majority. The GSRs that come to area are representing their groups. They are their groups trusted servant and can vote without taking everything back for discussion.
- d. Dan (New Journey): Likes how Vera handled the schedule but was upset about the bylaws. There was a reference in the email from the Secretary that there would be a bylaws vote with major substantive changes made but feels that this was not really sent back to the groups. We have a tradition of sending things back to groups, wants it to go back because wants to have a voice. Maybe we need a bylaws amendment about what things need to go back to groups. There is a tradition here and we can't just pretend that it is not an issue. Would like to have a group conscious and not be dictated by the executive committee.
- e. Mic: In regards to the issue about changing the schedule we are being told that the committee needs money period, that there is no way around that, but it is not up to the committee to tell us that. Why does the schedule need to be doubled in size? We didn't have any discussion about this. With major money motions the GSR votes but should be given the opportunity to bring it back to groups and that is not what is going on.
- f. Vera: PR did have a group conscious. We have been talking about this and working on it for a long time and we are out of room. We are letting the groups know this so they can help us decide what the next step should be. If people are concerned than they should go to a PR meeting and help us out.
- g. Maggi: Does not understand why is there any question about needing a bigger schedule? It is quite clear that we need more room. We can no longer add any new meetings.
- h. Tory: what I brought up was not directed at PR, not talking about any specific motion just feel that this is a bad precedent that was my point.
- i. Linda R: I am producing the schedule to best of my ability but very soon we will not be able to add any new groups. Just got a couple new meetings today and may or may not be able to fit them in.
- j. David: Hearing that we need more room on the schedule. The process of deciding on major money motions is being changed in that a motion is not being sent back to the groups. People are not feeling comfortable with the change. Suggest that we

stop now and bring this back next month to review. Maybe PR can look into other alternatives. Feels that we are not fully listening to each other.

- k. Travis: We are following the bylaws, traditions, and concepts and now that we are actually adhering to these it feels uncomfortable, because no one likes change. We need to take time to think about this issue to make a motion and in following the bylaws and concepts the GSRs are able to exercise the task given to them by the groups and vote.
- l. Ana: PR is doing exactly what this body entrusted them to do. In a motion last year PR was instructed to keep all Portland Metro meetings in the schedule. In order to comply with this dictate and continue to add new groups we need a bigger schedule. If as a group this is not acceptable than all that the GSR or group needs to do is make a motion.
- m. Mike: As a GSR would prefer to see money spent on a schedule because that is what is best for the primary purpose.
- n. Tony: PR is doing a great job and sees no problem adding to schedule – it is a good use of money.

Close the Meeting

Motion to close by Tuesday Night Freedom Fighters, seconded by Freedom in the Flats, motion passed and the meeting closed at 4:02pm.
